

## **SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

## How to submit an article to RERU?

Contributions should be sent to: RERU@asrdlf.org. An acknowledgment of reception will be sent to the authors within eight days.

The submitted papers must be original contributions, that have not been subject to publication or that are not being assessed in other journals. A cover letter will be sent along with the submitted text (See the cover letter that can be downloaded on the RERU website) and will underline that these conditions are met.

The authors that re-submit their article (after a rejection) must provide an accompanying letter specifying in details the changes that were made compared to the initial article that was initially rejected by reviewers.

All contributors to the RERU (Journal of Regional and Urban Economics) must assume full responsibility for their writings.

## **Refereeing process**

The manuscripts submitted for publication to the RERU are sent to an Associated Editor and are further evaluated in a blind and anonymous manner.

The papers are submitted, by the Associated Editor, for assessment to at least two referees whose identity, regardless the circumstances, will not be communicated to the authors or to any other person not involved in the editorial process.

After taking into account the remarks of the referees, the authors will send the revised manuscripts via email to the RERU Editorial Secretariat RERU: RERU@asrdlf.org

Taking on board the remarks and the changes suggested by the editors and the referees and applying the publication norms put forward by the reviewers and the editors of the RERU increase the chances of a manuscript being accepted for publication.

Once the manuscript is accepted for publication, a copy of the journal volume in which the manuscript is published and a .pdf of the article will be sent to the authors.

## **Articles Format and Layout**

The submitted manuscripts in French or English should not exceed 50 000 characters for articles, and 30,000 characters for research notes.

The form and content of the text must carefully meet the standards of RERU (see styles sheets downloadable on the RERU website).

The first page called the title page must include: the title in French and English; the authors' names, affiliations and addresses as well as their e-mail addresses; a note identifying the correspondent author; 2-5 keywords in French and English; the JEL (Journal of Economic Literature) codes

The abstracts in French and English (maximum 150 words by abstract) should give an idea of the whole article content.

Titles and subtitles should be short. The number of notes must be as reduced as possible.

The tables, illustrations and other figures are numbered consecutively.

The tables, illustrations and other figures should be composed of shades of gray. Authors should check the quality of the figures (i.e. legends size, readable labels on the axes of graphs ...) as this can be an element that determines the final acceptance of the article by RERU Associate Editors.

Authors must check the exact correspondence between the names and years referenced in the body text and in the bibliography. More information about the layout of the bibliography can be found in downloadable sheets style on the website of the RERU (i.e. one particular norm that RERU applies is that the names of the authors should appear in small caps in both the body text and in the bibliography).

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
